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A digital skills tool kit for low skilled adults focusing on women re-entering the labour market

RATIONALE

Long-term unemployment is one of the main concerns of policymakers. Apart from its financial and social effects on personal life, long-term unemployment negatively affects social cohesion and, ultimately, may hinder economic growth.

It is widely accepted that when European labour markets emerge from the current economic crisis they will be profoundly changed. If those who are long-term unemployed are to have any chance of finding quality employment they must be given the tools to successfully adjust to this new reality, as even 'old' jobs now require 'new' skills.

The current project comes to support the efforts of Member States to offer high quality opportunities to low-skilled, unemployed with a special focus on women to upgrade their digital and employability skills, so that they can be better empowered to re-enter work, address skills mismatches and exclusion, while promoting the digital agenda for Europe.

AIMS

The project aims:

- To promote digital literacy, while fighting skills mismatches and unemployment of low-skilled adults (focus on women) through a multi-assessed e-tool, based on an interactive and dynamic platform to be developed, in order to up-skill or re-skill their digital competences to meet the needs of labour market.
- To support this group of adults in their search for employment by equipping them with employability skills and by building bridges with the labour market through the creation of the on-line and in-house 'e-SKILLS4ALL-SUPPORT-HUBS' which will offer services to be developed in the project: i.e. skills audit, professional ICT training for re-skilling and up-skilling of digital skills and career guidance.

- To set up the e-SKILLS4ALL NETWORK where various organisations, stakeholders, agencies, public services etc. will offer guidance and advice for future employment by signing a Memorandum of Commitment to support employability prospects.
